CRRUA Now 94.8% Compliant in Correcting Deficiencies Identified by NMED

The Camino Real Regional Utility Authority (CRRUA) has corrected more deficiencies identified by the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) in its 2023 Sanitary Survey of CRRUA.

Of the 58-deficiencies NMED identified, CRRUA has now corrected 55, bringing it to 94.8% compliance.

CRRUA initiated a <u>Progress Checklist</u> to track the corrections. The latest deficiencies CRRUA corrected are numbers 52 and 55, which were water storage tank inspections.

The Progress Checklist is updated as corrections are made and is available for viewing on the home page of the CRRUA website at crrua.org.

"CRRUA has made tremendous progress in upgrading the utility system for the health and safety of our customers," said CRRUA Executive Director Juan Crosby. "These latest corrections bring us that much closer to reaching 100% compliance in addressing the deficiencies identified by NMED in its 2023 Sanitary Survey, which results in the continued delivery of safe water and improved service."

Crosby said other recent improvements include all four Arsenic Treatment Facilities (ATFs) becoming NMED compliant based on the department's Running Annual Average (RAA).

"We are treating water that continues to be below the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Maximum Contamination Level (MCL) of 10 parts per billion (ppb)," Crosby said.
